Hints & Tips for Windows 10

Disk Cleanup

Remember disk cleanup? It was a way to make your computer run faster when PCs had less RAM than they do today. Disk Cleanup fell by the wayside for most of us as PCs and laptops have become more sophisticated. But your computer could still use a de-bloating now and again.

Disk Cleanup is a simple way to delete files and to ensure your Recycle Bin is cleared out. On Windows 10, type "disk cleanup" into your taskbar where it says, "Type here to search" >> Click on Disk Cleanup app >> Put a check mark next to each folder you want to be deleted, such as temporary files.

Shake Your Windows

Here's a fun one. If you have stacks and stacks of windows open, and you want to declutter down to just one, do this. Click on the top bar of your desired window, hold it down, and shake the mouse to instantly minimize all other open windows. Do it again to restore those windows.

Show Desktop Button

This desktop button actually dates back to Windows 7, but is handy nonetheless. On the bottom-right corner of the desktop is a secret button. Don't see it? Look all the way to the bottom and right, beyond the date and time. There you'll find a small little sliver of an invisible button. Click it to minimize all your open windows.

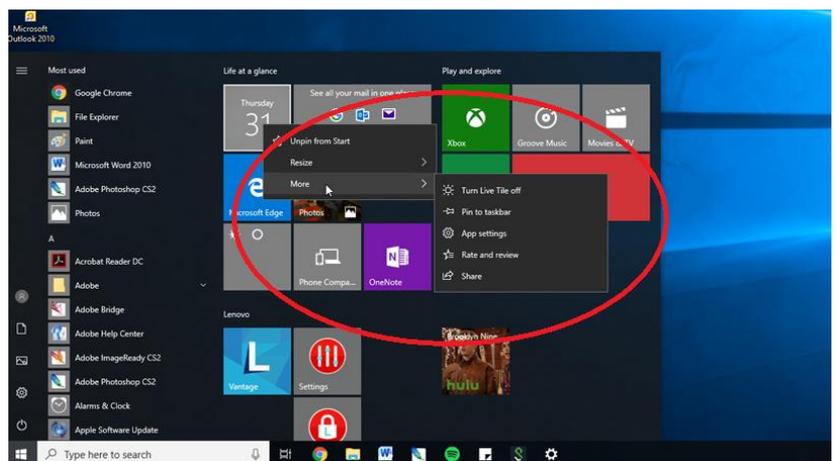
There's also the option to have windows minimize when you hover over this button versus clicking. Select your preference in Settings > Personalization > Taskbar > Use peek to preview the desktop.

Right-Click on Tiles

Want to personalize those tiles quick?

Just right-click on them to prompt a pop-up menu.

This menu will give you various options like the ability to un-pin from the Start menu, resize the windows, or turn that live tile off.

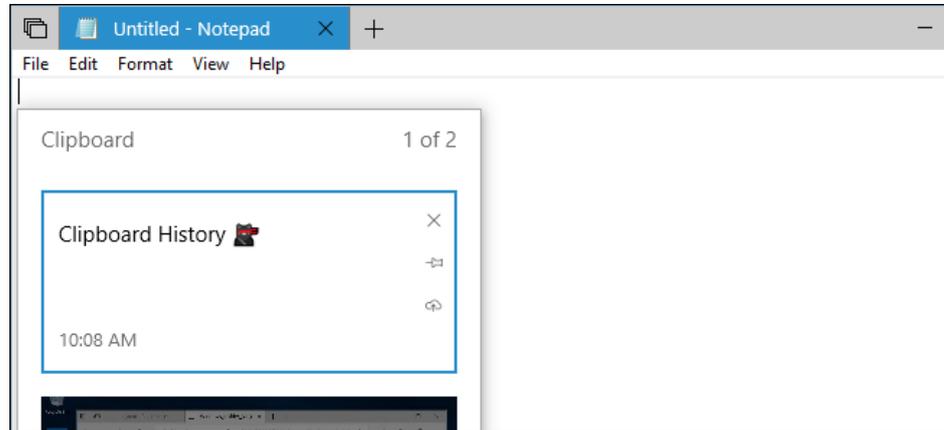


What's New in Windows 10's October 2018 Update

Windows 10's October 2018 Update, also known as version 1809 and codenamed Redstone 5 during its development process, is coming soon. This major upgrade includes a clipboard history that syncs between your devices and a long-awaited dark theme for File Explorer.

Clipboard History and Sync

The October 2018 Update gains some powerful new clipboard features. There's now a clipboard history that you can access by pressing Windows+V. You can optionally synchronize this



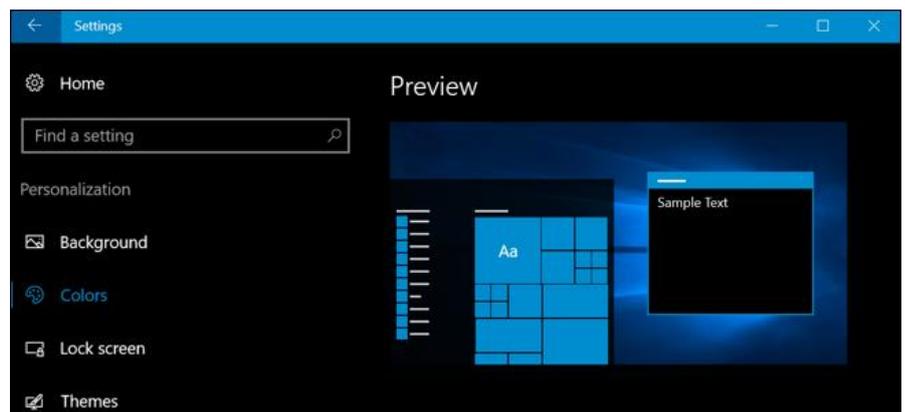
clipboard history between your devices, giving you a clipboard that synchronizes itself between your PCs. You also can sync manually by clicking an icon in the clipboard popup, preventing Windows from synchronizing potentially sensitive data like passwords and credit card numbers.

In the future, Microsoft will add support for the cloud clipboard to its SwiftKey keyboard for Android, iPhone, and iPad. You'll be able to copy and paste between your phone or tablet and your Windows PC.

A Dark Theme for File Explorer

Windows 10 now includes a dark theme for File Explorer. It is enabled automatically if you so that a system-wide dark theme from Settings > Personalization > Colors.

Microsoft has added dark theme support to the File Explorer context menus, including the context menu that appears when you right-click your desktop. There's also a new dark theme for the standard Open and Save file dialog windows.

Apple Tips & Tricks - Tips from the Apple web site

Update your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch

Update to iOS 12

iOS 12 makes your iPhone, iPad, and iPod touch more powerful, personal, and intelligent than ever before.

Update your device wirelessly

If a message says that an update is available, tap Install Now. You can also follow these steps:



1. Plug your device into power and connect to the Internet with Wi-Fi.
2. Tap Settings > General > Software Update.
3. Tap Download and Install. If a message asks to temporarily remove apps because iOS needs more space for the update, tap Continue or Cancel. Later, iOS will reinstall apps that it removed. If you tap Cancel, learn what to do next.

4. To update now, tap Install. Or you can tap Later and choose Install Tonight or Remind Me Later. If you tap Install Tonight, just plug your iOS device into power before you go to sleep. Your device will update automatically overnight.

5. If asked, enter your passcode. If you don't know your passcode, [learn what to do](#).

If you see an error or need more space when updating wirelessly

If you see an error message while trying to update your device wirelessly, [learn what to do](#). If you need more space for a wireless update, you can [update using iTunes](#) or [delete content manually](#) from your device. Whether you use iTunes or update wirelessly, you'll have the same amount of free space on your device after you update.

Some iOS software updates aren't available wirelessly. VPN or proxy connections might prevent your device from contacting the iOS update servers.

Update automatically

With iOS 12, you can have your iOS device update automatically. To turn on automatic updates, go to Settings > General > Software Update > Automatic Updates. Your iOS device will automatically update to the latest version of iOS. Some updates might need to be installed manually.

Use Screen Time to get insights about how you use your device

With Screen Time, you can access real-time reports about how much time you spend on your iPhone and iPad and set limits for what you want to manage.



Screen Time — a new feature of iOS 12 — lets you know how much time you and your kids spend on apps, websites, and more. This way, you can make more informed decisions about how you use your devices and set limits if you'd like to.

Read on to learn how to turn on Screen Time, view your report and set limits.

Turn on Screen Time

1. On your iPhone or iPad, go to Settings > Screen Time.
2. Tap Turn On Screen Time.
3. Tap Continue.
4. Select This is My [device].

You can now get a report about how you use your device, apps, and websites, any time you want.

View your report and set limits

Screen Time gives you a detailed report about how your device is used, apps you've opened, and websites you've visited, any time that you want to see it. Just go to Settings > Screen Time and tap the graph. There, you can see your usage, set limits for your Most Used apps, and see how many times a device was picked up or received a notification.

If you turned on Share Across Devices, you can view overall usage across devices that are signed in with your Apple ID and password.
